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## **Black Bear Dance**

Black Bear Dance was written for the annual concert of the Esprit de Cor ensemble of Lexington, MA. Ms. Marshall has written several pieces for Esprit de Cor over the years and plays in their annual concert. In 2006, she wanted to indulge her love of drumming and mix that with the horns. The result is a jazzy, lighthearted piece that is a lot of fun to play.

After writing the music there was the problem of a name. The composer writes: "The rehearsals for my choral piece *Weaving the World* in March with the Assabet Valley Mastersingers gave me the name for the horn piece. There's a line in Janisse Ray's text that reads 'and black bears roam the woods unseen'. The choral director rehearsed it a lot, looking for a natural declamation and in-tune intervals. As I thought about a name for the emphatic, dance-like horns-and-drums music, I couldn't get the image of black bears out of my mind, so I decided it must be the right title. I worried that the name might imply an American Indian musical style, which the music is not. Then on the Internet I found the Bear Dance painting of William Holbrook Beard. Aside from the fact that he was mocking stock-market bears, the image was just right."

## **Drum parts**

The drum part is meant to be played by a group of drummers using hand drums. The drum part is written with the African djembe in mind, but the players can use any selection of drums that is available. Some amount of improvising is OK too, as long as the rhythms stay synchronized between the horns and drums and the drums don't overwhelm with too much volume. Drumming groups tend to get faster and faster, while horns often drag, so a conductor is probably necessary to keep both groups together.
